The next ordinance coming before Council will be pertaining to smoking marijuana in public, traffic ordinances, and possession of it on an individual.

Mr. Venable moved, and Ms. Dorman seconded the motion for Bill No. 2019-019 to have its First Reading on July 15, 2019 and Second Reading on August 5, 2019. With no questions, roll call was taken. ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BOONVILLE, MISSOURI ESTABLISHING ARTICLE XIII, MEDICAL MARIJUANA FACILITIES IN CHAPTER 10, LICENSES AND TAXATION, BOONVILLE CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREFORE AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, An amendment to Missouri's Constitution was approved by voters on November 2, 2018 allowing access to Medical Marijuana in Missouri; and

WHEREAS, Medical marijuana uses are licensed and regulated by the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, The Planning and Zoning Commission considered these changes on May 14, 2019 at a public meeting.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOONVILLE, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That Chapter 10, Licenses and Taxation, is amended to add Article XIII, Medical Marijuana Facilities, as set forth in **Exhibit A**, which is incorporated herein as set out fully in this ordinance as set out fully in this ordinance.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force after passage and approval.

SECTION 3: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

ARTICLE XIII. MEDICAL MARIJUANA FACILITIES**Sec. 10-282 Definitions**

Inspection Authority means City staff who shall inspect annually medical marijuana facilities and can include: the police chief (or his/her designee), the fire chief (or his/her designee), and the building inspector.

Marijuana means Cannabis indica, Cannabis sativa, and Cannabis ruderalis, hybrids of such species, and any other strains commonly understood within the scientific community to constitute marijuana, as well as seed thereof and resin extracted from the plant and marijuana-infused products. Marijuana does not include industrial hemp containing a crop-wide average tetrahydrocannabinol concentration that does not exceed three-tenths of one percent on a dry weight bases, or commodities or products manufactured from industrial hemp.

Medical Marijuana-Infused Products means products that are infused with marijuana or an extract thereof and are intended for use or consumption other than by smoking, including, but not limited to, edible products, ointments, tinctures and concentrates.

Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility means a facility licensed by the State of Missouri to acquire, cultivate, process, store, transport and sell marijuana to a Medical Dispensary Facility, Medical Marijuana Testing Facility, or to a Medical Marijuana-Infused Products Manufacturing Facility.

Medical Marijuana Dispensary Facility means a facility licensed by the State of Missouri to acquire, store, sell, transport and deliver marijuana, marijuana-infused products and drug paraphernalia used to administer marijuana as provided for in this section to a qualifying patient, a primary caregiver, another Medical Marijuana Dispensary Facility, a Medical Marijuana Testing Facility or a Medical Marijuana- Infused Products Manufacturing Facility.

Medical Marijuana-Infusion/Manufacturing Facility means a facility licensed by the State of Missouri to acquire, store, manufacture, transport and sell marijuana-infused products to a Medical Marijuana Dispensary, a Medical Marijuana Test Facility or to another Medical Marijuana- Infused Products Manufacturing Facility.

Medical marijuana Testing Facility means a facility certified by the State of Missouri to acquire, test, certify and transport marijuana.

Medical Marijuana Facilities means all medical marijuana facilities including medical marijuana cultivation facility, medical marijuana dispensary, medical marijuana infusion/manufacturing facility and medical marijuana testing facility.

Sec. 10-283 Operating PermitsSection 10-283. Operating Permits.

- a. No Medical Marijuana Facility shall be allowed to operate without a current permit issued by the City of Boonville, including but not by way of limitation, dispensaries, manufacturing facilities, cultivation facilities and testing facilities as defined in this Article III.

- b. Any person desiring to operate a medical marijuana dispensary, manufacturing, cultivation or testing facility as defined in Article III shall submit a written application for a permit on a form provided by the City of Boonville. The application shall include the applicant's full name, address, telephone number, location of the proposed facility and such additional information as shall be required for the City to enforce the provisions of Article III
- c. After receipt of the completed application by the City, the head of the appropriate City Department (Inspection Authority) shall inspect the proposed facility to determine whether the facility is in compliance with the provisions of Article III. A written notice shall be provided within ten (10) business days to the operator of such facility identifying all matters of noncompliance. A facility may require inspection by more than one Inspection Authority in order to receive a permit.
- d. If applicable, the person(s) seeking a permit for a medical marijuana-related facility that requires a health inspection shall submit the appropriate form to the Cooper County Health Department who shall conduct such inspection. A written form from the Cooper County Health Department showing compliance with all current health regulations shall be submitted to the City before a City permit will be issued.
- e. The City shall not issue a permit relating to a medical marijuana-related facility until the applicant supplies a true and complete copy of all "State-required" licenses issued to the applicant for such a facility indicating such license is current and in good standing with the State of Missouri. The City operating permit will be issued only to the same person/entity that holds the applicable State license.
- f. An annual inspection fee of \$100.00 shall be paid to the City at the time of application for the City permit.
- g. A permit for a medical marijuana-related facility may be granted at any time during a calendar year, but all such permits shall expire on the 31st day of the next succeeding December and shall be subject to renewal at that time. Medical marijuana-related facility permits shall not be assignable or transferrable without the express, prior written consent of the City.
- h. All medical marijuana permits, together with a copy of any applicable regulations required by law to be posted, shall be posted at all times in a conspicuous place in the facility.
- i. The terms "permit" and "license" may be used interchangeably for purposes of this Article III.

Sec. 10-284 Suspension and revocation of permits

- a. The City may suspend or revoke a permit issued to any Medical Marijuana Facility by the City for failure of the permit holder to comply with the requirements of this Article III or the requirements of the permit holders' State license. Whenever the applicable Inspection Authority for the City finds unsecure, unsafe, or inadequate conditions at a medical marijuana-related facility which in the judgment of such Inspection Authority constitutes a substantial hazard to the public health and safety of the community and its citizens, the Inspection

Authority shall notify the City Administrator or other appropriate City Staff person. The Inspection Authority may issue a written notice to the permit holder citing such condition(s) deemed to be out of compliance with the requirements of the City permit and specifying the corrective action to be taken in order to mitigate such conditions. The notice shall further state the time period within which such corrective action must be completed. If deemed a substantial and continuing hazard to the public health and security, an Interlocutory Order may be issued by the appropriate member of the governing body of the City that the City permit is immediately suspended pending a hearing on the matter. Any permit holder to whom such an Order is issued shall comply immediately with the Order, but upon written petition to the City Administrator, shall be afforded an administrative hearing by the City Administrator within five business days. In the event such administrative hearing shall result in an adverse decision to the permit holder, the permit holder may file a petition with the City Council appealing such decision, in which event a public hearing by the City Council shall be granted to the permit holder within 30 days of the filing of such appeal.

- b. In lieu of an administrative hearing or appeal, any permit holder whose permit has been suspended or revoked may request a reinspection or reinstatement of the permit. Within five business days of receiving such request for reinspection, the City shall reinspect the facility. If the applicant is found to be in compliance and can produce a current State license, the City permit shall be immediately reinstated.
- c. Any person or entity who holds a City permit but who has their State license suspended or revoked by the State of Missouri Department of Health and Human Services shall also have its corresponding City permit suspended or revoked.

Sec. 10-285 General Regulations, Medical Marijuana Dispensary

- a. Medical marijuana dispensaries shall be permitted to conduct business operations only between the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. the following morning, Monday- Saturday. Such facilities shall remain closed at all other times.
- b. Medical marijuana dispensaries shall not sell, vend, give away or otherwise supply medical marijuana to any person or qualified caregiver who does not possess a current patient or caregiver ID card, or who otherwise is not legally qualified to receive medical marijuana

Sec. 10-286 Distance from churches and schools, Medical Marijuana Facilities

- a. A Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility, a Medical Marijuana-Infusion/Manufacturing Facility, and a Medical marijuana Testing Facility must be located in a C-2 District or higher.
- b. A Medical Marijuana Dispensary must be located in a C-1 district or higher.
- c. The set distance that Medical Marijuana Facilities are required to remain away from any elementary or secondary school, day care, church, or other building regularly used as a place of religious worship shall be as follows:

1. Medical Marijuana Cultivation Facility: 0 feet.
2. Medical Marijuana-Infusion/Manufacturing Facility: 0 feet.
3. Medical marijuana Testing Facility: 0 feet.
4. Medical Marijuana Dispensary Facility: 100 feet. Distance shall be measured from building to building. Unless the applicant shall first obtain, in writing, the consent of the City Council. Such consent shall not be granted until at least ten (10) days written notice has been provided to all owners of property within 100 feet of the proposed Medical Marijuana Dispensary Facility.

SECTION 3: This resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

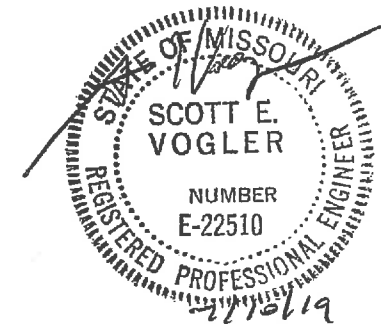
